The Appalachians

The Appalachian physical region makes up the east coast of Canada. The biggest islands found in this region include Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island and Cape Breton Island. Parts of Quebec are also included in this region along with Nova Scotia.

The physical features found in this region include mountains, plateaus and hills. The Appalachian region is part of a range of mountains.



CLIMATE

VEGETATION AND WILDLIFE
